Dairy Herdsperson Apprenticeship

Cost: \$450.00/year

600 hrs in-class training over 2 years

Start date: September 13, 2011 – April 6, 2012

The Dairy Herdsperson Apprentice Program provides an opportunity for individuals currently employed in the dairy industry to acquire recognized certification of their skills and knowledge. The program also provides training and certification for new employees or students entering the work force in the dairy industry.

The Dairy Herdsperson Apprentice Program is the first in a series of agriculture apprenticeships developed by the industry with assistance from the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities (MTCU). The Dairy

Herdsperson Apprentice program is a joint venture between the employer, MTCU, and University of Guelph Kemptville Campus. The program consists of an in-school curriculum and an on-the-job training component. In-school sessions take place 4 days per month, the first week of every month, September through April.

Horse Groom Apprenticeship (Coming 2012)

Fall 2012

These courses are available to apprentices registered with the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities.

Horse Grooms work with riding establishments, stables, and racetracks, and are responsible for the maintenance, health, nutrition, feeding, and grooming of horses. They also operate and maintain barn mechanical and electrical systems, perform farm mechanical equipment repair, and maintain stable and pasture facilities. The Horse Groom works closely with veterinarians, nutritionists, farriers, horse owners/trainers, and suppliers. Employers in this field are looking for people who have some high school mathematics, sciences, and problem-solving skills.

Apprentices must have an Ontario Secondary School Diploma or the equivalent.

An exception to the grade 12 requirement can be made for full-time high school students who are registered in the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program. In-school training for the Horse Groom Apprenticeship at Kemptville Campus is contingent on sufficient student registration.

Kemptville Campus, in co-operation with the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities and industry members of Landscape Ontario's Ottawa Chapter, are pleased to offer in-school training for Horticultural Technician Apprentices. The Horticulture Technician Apprenticeship provides apprentices with the opportunity to continue their education, while maintaining full-time employment in the Horticulture industry.

This program is divided into 2 separate and advanced segments, each offered in alternating years. Basic and advanced sessions are 12 weeks in duration. Upon successful completion of the 2 in-school training periods and the required workplace hours, the apprentice is awarded a Journeyperson Certificate from the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities (MTCU).

To register as an apprentice, contact the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities (MTCU at 1-877-221-1220). All apprentices must have an Ontario Secondary School Diploma or recognized equivalent, unless they are members of the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (available through local high schools).

Welder Apprenticeship

This Level II in-school training is specific to Welder 456A Trades. Registered Apprentices in those trades attend school one day per week to complete their 180 hours of training.

This Level III in-school training is specific to Welder 456A Trades. Registered Apprentices in those trades attend school one day per week to complete their 240 hours of training.

Pre-Apprentice Welder (Pending MTCU approval)

Cost: All tuition, supplies and equipment costs covered by MTCU/40 weeks (including work placement)

Date: May 2012 – February 2013

Students will learn the basics of welding and fabrication, in addition to machining. The program includes 2 components; all of the in-school training for the Level 1 Welder Apprenticeship, and the Level 1 Common Core Precision Machining and Tooling. Math, communications, health & safety, resume writing and computer skills will also be taught. The program is intended to provide women and recent immigrants to Canada, with the skills for entry level positions in the welding trade so no previous welding or machining experience is required. Limited Enrollment. Entrance Requirements are: must be a woman or recent immigrant, must have achieved an OSSD or currently pursuing a high school equivalency. Interview and mechanical reasoning test.

Food Service Worker Certificate

The Food Service Worker Certificate is a program designed to meet the Ministry of Health Long Term Care requirements for dietary aids working in health care in Ontario.

The certificate program is a part-time evening program consisting of 6 different modules, one night per week for 3 hours. It also includes a 30 hour volunteer field placement (where required) at an additional cost of \$185. The modules can be completed in any order with exception of nutrition modules which must be completed consecutively. Courses are delivered by experienced instructors anywhere in Eastern Ontario where minimum class sizes are met.

1. Intro – Role of the Food Service Worker

This is an introductory module that highlights the various topics to be covered throughout the FSW program and responsibilities of the FSW at LTC facilities. Small Engine Repair

Date: September 20 – November 22

Cost: \$485.00 plus HST – 30 hours - One evening per week for 10 weeks.

In this hands-on course you'll learn how to maintain, troubleshoot and repair your lawn-mower, tiller, snow-thrower, chainsaw etc. Bring your engine with no more than 5 hp. You should come to class with certified work boots, safety glasses (mandatory). Useful items to have with you are: masking tape, coveralls, pens, pencils, highlighter, calculator and paper. This course will cover: safety, basic engine design, operational theory, fuel, ignition, cooling, lubrication, trouble shooting. Successful completion of this course will provide the participant with enhanced small engine repair and diagnostic skills.

Practical evaluation and testing consists of operating in limited space areas with load.
